



### Sustainable development in TFCAs: Profits, conservation & livelihoods • Profits: viable business, \$ for conservation, value chain linkages, **Economic** poverty reduction, PPPs • Conservation: biodiversity, ecosystem services, resource use (energy, water), waste, infrastructure footprint, behaviour & health changes in wildlife • Livelihoods: inhabitants/local **Environment** Social communities, linkages, culture, education, public support Convention on Biological Diversity, CoP, Nagoya, Japan - www.cbd.int Target increase terrestrial PAs to 17% & marine PAs to 10% by 2020

## Sustainable development and TFCAs:

Roles of different stakeholders

- Public sector: Policy context & institutional framework, planning, infrastructure, governance
- **Donors:** \$\$\$, objectives, implementation processes
- NGOs: Objectives, capacity & skills, funds
- Private sector: Linkages to market, profit, PPPs, access to land, supply chains, labour
- **Communities:** Capacity, SMMEs, land tenure, poverty, insecurity
