Case Presentation

- Adult
- Poor body condition (5 kg)
- Severely dehydrated and weak
- Green diarrhoea and regurgitation
- Tx with fluids, atropine
- Responded to fluids, no tremors
- Died an hour later

Case Presentation

- Interest from Whatsapp group to test for lead
- No capacity within Botswana
- VFWT agreed to import samples for testing



Next Steps

- Concern about shipping samples internationally via courier and delayed handling at the border
- Private airline refused to transport biological material
- Ultimately agreed to send samples to Kasane and collect by road
- Samples shipped overnight from Gaborone to Kasane, frozen contents returned to freezer until pickup

Border Procedures

- Declared samples at customs, Botswana side Kazungula border post
 - Brief visual inspection at customs
- Declared samples at customs, Zimbabwe side Kazungula border post
 - Noted "vet samples" on customs form

Outcomes

- Submitted to University of Zimbabwe
 No lead or cadmium detected
- Suboptimal samples for lead
 - Eyes were collected but went missingFixed tissues submitted instead of fresh
