

Animal Health Forum

- AHF is a new discussion format introduced in 2024 to discuss in details a topical subject in animal health, and guided by a Technical Item presented by experts;
- In 2024 it was on challenges for the global control of HPAI following a technical item: "Strategic Challenges in the Global Control of High Pathogenicity Avian Influenza" findings were crystalised under Resolution No. 28. https://www.woah.org/app/uploads/2023/06/a-resos-2023-all.pdf

RESOLUTION No. 29: Veterinary Vaccines and Vaccination


WOAH to:

- promote vaccine research and development, including through PPP, as well as mutual recognition agreements for the registration of novel vaccine;
- develop and update international standards for the vaccine safety, efficacy, integration of new technologies and, when applicable, safe trade of vaccinated animals and their products, ensuring global recognition and trust.
- Members Countries implement standards to promote acquisition and maintenance of free disease status, and avoid unjustified trade restrictions, promoting transparency, consistency, and mutual recognition of veterinary certifications to facilitate safe international trade;
- Promote the use of vaccines to reduce the need for using antimicrobials.
- in collaboration with stakeholders, assesses the inclusion of provisions for aquatic animal vaccines in the Aquatic Animal Health Code and Manual, ensuring that aquatic animal vaccination is recognised, standardised, and harmonised;

RESOLUTION No. 29: Veterinary Vaccines and Vaccination

- completes the deployment of the global alert system on substandard and falsified veterinary products to strengthen vaccine quality oversight and support the removal of these vaccines from circulation;
- WOAH and its Members improve vaccine forecasting needs and national procurement processes, in coordination with vaccine manufacturers,
- continue to advocate for the strategic use of vaccination as a complementary tool to contribute towards sustainable disease control.


